




Supporting OA is a priority for Jisc


Inform/ disseminate models of 'good practice'

Some trends...


- Modern/ post-92 institutions (Oxford Brookes, **Coventry, Hull and Northumbria)**
 - Small but growing research bases whose ambition is not met by the RCUK block grant allocation
- Publisher engagement- (RLUK subgroup)
 - How publishers' submission and publication process is integrated with OA procedures
 - How HEI's metadata needs can be better met by publishers
 - What HEIs and publishers can do better together to support researchers
- Cost management (Bath)
 - APC process management- UCL released their database
 - Issue of admin cost overheads- London Higher/ SPARC: 'Counting the costs of OA' report
 - ? Off-setting schemes- how they are evaluated and embedded into workflows






Pathfinder Update- where are we now?
